He served in the Royal Navy as a medical orderly on a tank landing craft transporting men and tanks to the Juno beach head. After the tanks went ashore, the empty space was used to accommodate the wounded, whom Bill and his comrades tended. He was awarded the Chevalier Le`gion d' Honour medal, the highest order of merit in France, for his effort and service. "We did what was required of us. I did my duty, we all did our duty."
