Woodlands and Meadows

The recent dry spell in mid-November allowed us to complete the steps on both sides of the river allowing easier access to the Steppingstones. The approach to the river is now relatively safe however the Steppingstones themselves continue to be a challenge to all but the sure footed and certainly shouldn't be used in the wet or when water levels are high.

As part of a registered Local Nature Reserve the Woodlands management plan follows the advice of Government Agencies in respect of 'Ancient Woodlands', in particular fallen timber is left where it falls to provide habitat for insects and other small creatures. Where fallen timber forms a hazard, across paths for example, the woodlands volunteers will make it safe and use it in other areas of the woods. Removing timber would require formal permission from the Parish Council.
