Activities included the duck race and easter trail for the children. Refreshed and tied the back of war memorial. Supported Joe with his African trip. A plaque to commemorate the centenary of WI, and one for the hedgehog seat. Looking forward, the playing field is 40 years old - to look at the play equipment.

Meadows - nothing to report

UCBS - nothing new to report, over the last month, 2 individuals were introduced - both have now viewed and made offers to the owner, both intending to reestablish the premises as a public house.

Cllr Scott: Windfarm benefit committee 9 bids 7 successful 1 partly successful £68,000 paid out on the night

Total paid out over 1million pounds - minimum bid was £750 has now been raised to £1000 maximum £20,000 there is money for next year - first applications grants in January. £174,000 available for next year.

Neighbourhood Plan, a meeting on 14th November with Mark Harrison from NCC. Our neighbourhood plan for the village is over 25 years old. There would be a designated officer able to guide us through the process. Can take up to 18months - 2 years - £10,000 fund available to support. All residents would have their say via survey though the village. Agreement to take this forward was approved. ACTION: Deb Wilson

Cllr Brown: NCC have been working hard to clean/clear drains in the village. Some drains unfortunately were covered by cars. A request that cars are not parked directly over drains.

The bin at the top of the hill is 'toppling', although it is sitting on concrete, it will be reviewed. Resident asked why it is positioned where it is - this was at the request of County due to parking van when emptying.

Retrospective question by resident re electricity, work was planned on the line between Ulgham and Longhirst, was this completed? ACTION: Deb Wilson

Reminder by Cllr Shaw that Northernpower do have the facility to pay for accommodation and food if no electricity for over 24 hours.

Work has started on the stables, expecting to start demolition soon.

Behind the war memorial - needs some extra gravel. ACTION: Cllr Scott
