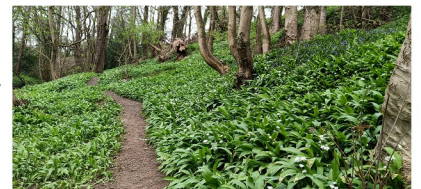
Fun at the Easter Monday trail
