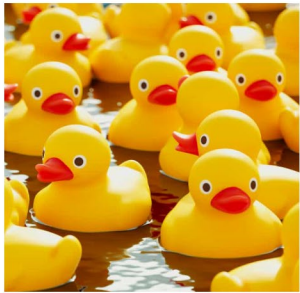
"May is the month of promise and the sweet beginnings of Summer." Forever hopeful, anyway!

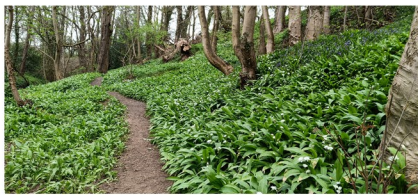
